Grade 10 student Matthew Henderson has all began when Matthew saw his friend and

classmate, Adam Stewart, was facing a tough situation. Adam's mother had recently battled breast cancer and had been placed in remission. Seeing a need and wanting to help, Matthew posted on the Reebok facebook page. He suggested that if his post reached over 3000 likes in 24 hours that the company should make a pink hockey stick in honour of Breast Cancer awareness. The next morning Matthew was shocked to find that his post had reached over 10,000 likes. Reebok, unable to ignore Matthew's comment, sent him a message asking what he would do with the hockey stick if they made it. He is response was to have it signed by Sidney Crosby and then sell it, giving all the proceeds to breast cancer research. The company was impressed. The stick was made and Reebok had a representative get it signed by Sid the Kid. The signed stick was then sent to Matthew.

Matthew's next challenge was to find a buyer for the stick. Partnering with Budrow Tozer from Irving Oil, the two found a buyer in Mark Sherman, the General Manager of Irving Refinery. Sherman donated \$10,000 for the hockey stick to put toward research against this disease. On May 28<sup>th</sup>, Matthew visited the company during lunch to raffle off the stick to one of the employees. He then learned that Irving Oil raised an additional \$5000 on Matthew's behalf. The cheque was eventually handed to Charlene Hayes, an advocate for Breast Cancer Awareness.
