Sports Fees



During a meeting between a group of principals, the discussion of sports fees and grad fees came up. Grad fees at most of the schools were \$150 and that didn't give the graduate anything other than their name in the program. Sports fees ranged from \$1300 for Sr. Boys Basketball to \$250 for soccer. So I thought I would give you folks an idea of where your \$100 sports fee goes to. Here is a snapshot for Sr. Girls Soccer. We had 18 girls at \$100 each - \$1800 to get us through the season. Our expenses were Equipment (\$248.76), NBIAA Fees (\$163.25); Referees (\$275); and Tournament Fees (\$1,112.99). So in the end we broke even. Many of our teams go in the hole by about \$100 and the school has to pick up that extra cost which in turn makes us have to up the fees for the following year. It is my goal at NSER to make sure that we breakeven. I am not looking to make money off my teams but I have to make sure that the teams can cover their costs.

Exciting News for NSER ... As you may have already read, NSER is now a SAT Testing Centre. But what are SATs? The SAT is a globally recognized college admission test that lets you show colleges what you know and how well you can apply that knowledge. It tests your knowledge of reading, writing and math — subjects that are taught every day in high school classrooms. Administered by The College Board, the SAT and AP exams are key for gaining acceptance to American universities. Most students take the SAT during their junior or senior year of high school, and almost all colleges and universities use the SAT to make admission decisions. But SAT scores are just one of many factors that colleges consider when making their admission decisions. High school grades are also very important. In fact, the combination of high school grades and SAT scores is the best predictor of your academic success in college. Many colleges use the SAT Subject Tests for admission, for course placement, and to advise students about course selection.

Facts:

- *The SAT tests your abilities in three areas: reading, writing and mathematical reasoning.
- *The test consists of several multiple-choice questions and an essay.
- *A score of **200-800** is given in each section, providing a maximum score of **2400**.
- *The test takes about 4 hours to write.
