Logan was recognized by teachers and adults as being a very polite and respectful individual.

Logan was tragically killed in a car accident in April of 2019.

- demonstrate leadership at North and South Esk Regional High School
- exhibit genuine care of others
- show respect and compassion for students, teachers and staff
- be involved in high school athletics at North and South Esk Regional High School

- continue onto post-secondary education with a program requirement of at least one academic year
