Earthday



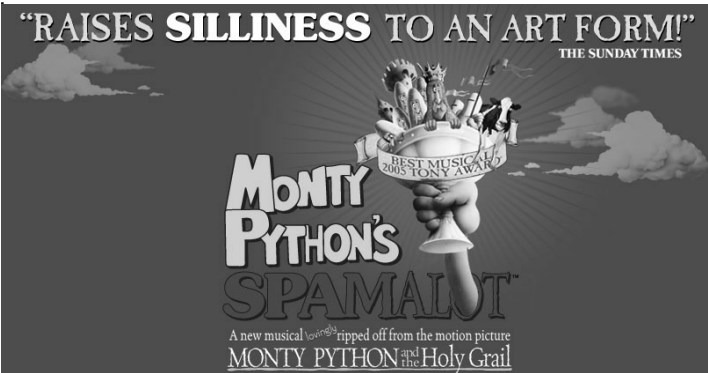

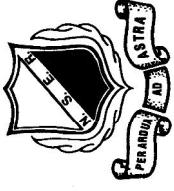

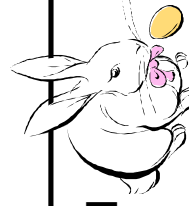
