**NSER Mission:** It is the mission of NSER to support and challenge students to meet and exceed their potential.

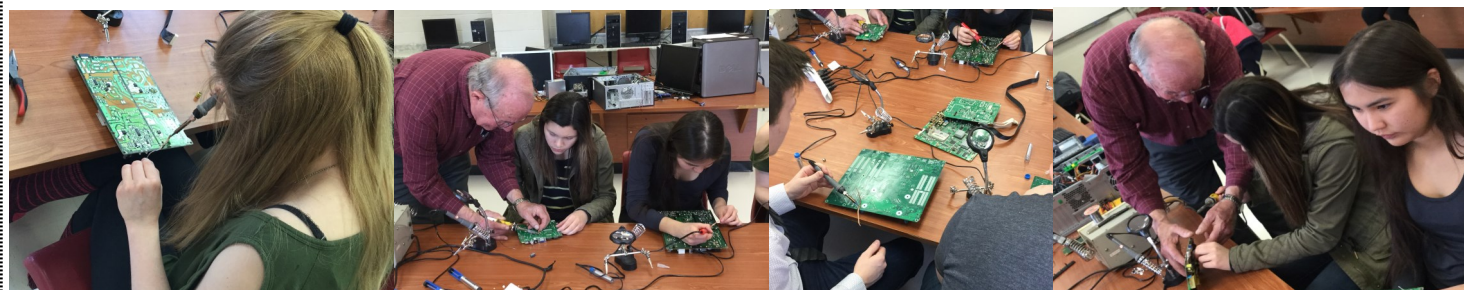
**NSER Vision:** NSER's number one priority is the intellectual development of its students and also giving priority to social, emotional and physical development.

## NBTAP 2017

Applications are now open for the 2017 NBTAP. The New Brunswick Teen Apprentice Program (NBTAP) is an industry led pre-apprentice program for qualifying students starting in Grade 10 or Grade 11. NBTAP facilitates the early connection between industries facing a potential skilled trades labour gap and young New Brunswickers. Over two or three paid summer work terms, selected students are coached and mentored on the job by participating employers. NBTAP Student Apprentices learn practical trade and workplace skills and get a head start on an exciting career in the skilled trades. To apply a 70% average is recommended, as well as good attendance. However, interested applicants will be interviewed to determine their interest and commitment to the program. 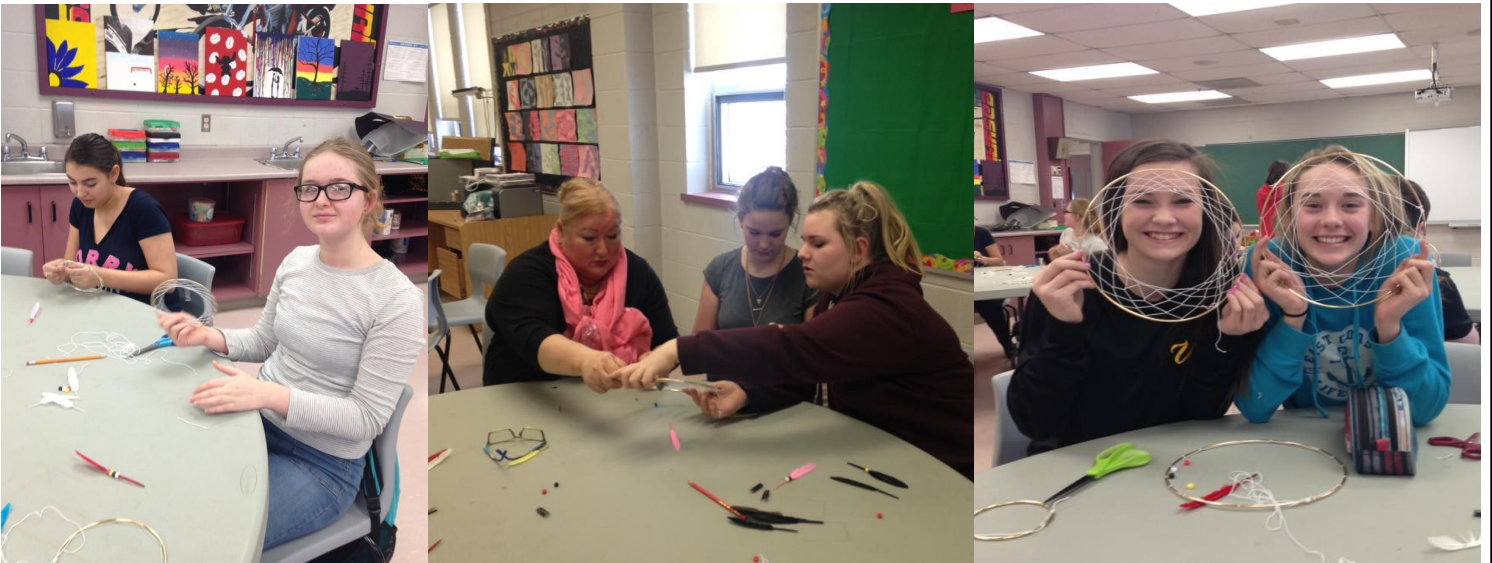
