North and South Esk Regional High School has arranged for a Blood Donor Clinic to be held in the school gymnasium on Friday, March 16th. Clinic hours are from 10:00am-12 noon and again from 1:00pm-3:30pm. Appointments can be booked ahead of time by calling the school at 836-7000. To donate, you must be at least 17 years of age, in general good health, and feeling well on the day of your donation. If you have never donated before and have had your 61st birthday, or if you are between the ages of 67 and 71, and have not donated within the last two years, you must be assessed by a physician who must fill out and sign the following letter. You must also meet the other standard requirements for donation.

Canadian Blood Services collects whole blood. Whole blood is comprised of red blood cells, How much blood does it take to save a life? white blood cells, platelets and plasma. Some donations are held and transfused as whole blood, others are processed to separate red blood cells and plasma.


Canadian Blood Services is responsible for

recruiting blood and bone marrow donors, as well as collecting blood, plasma, and platelets at 41 permanent collection sites and more than 19,000 donor clinics annually. Approximately every minute of every day, someone in Canada needs blood. In fact, according to a recent poll, 52 per
