





North & South Esk Regional October 2016

All Doors Locked



All doors at NSER are locked at 8:30 am. All students and visitors must buzz in after that time. We have a security system at the front doors. When you arrive at NSER, you will see a silver intercom box on the far left of the main doors. Just press the button and

someone will buzz you into the school. There are brief times during the day when there is no one in the office to buzz in. Visitors may want to call ahead.

CELL PHONES

Students are permitted to use cell phones while at school, however, they are not to be used during instructional hours. Teachers may confiscate a phone until the end of the day should a student be using them during instructional time.
