Winter Camp

NSER is seeking host families for the Winter Camp Program from February 3-10, 2018. The Winter Camp Program, involving students from the Concord Colleges of Sino-Canada, will take place for one week at New Brunswick High Schools. The dates for this year's Winter Camp will be February 3 – February 10, 2018.

This day signifies a day of remembrance, but also a day to affirm that "Every Child Matters" and the commitment to ensure a better future for all children.

What is Mindfulness?

You may hear students talking about "mindfulness" over the next few months. So what is mindfulness and why is it important? Mindfulness can be defined as a way of paying attention "on purpose, in the present moment, and nonjudgmentally" (Kabat-Zinn, 1994). The Learning to Breathe curriculum that we are implementing with small groups of students in grades 7-10 is designed to help students better recognize and understand the nature of thoughts and emotions. As well, the mindfulness activities are designed to help students fine tune their focus, slow down their thoughts and reduce their stress levels. Mindfulness practice can help students:

regulate anxiety before a test

concentrate in class

handle difficult moods

handle everyday stress
