Attendance Policy

In September 2015, Anglophone North School District introduced the High School Attendance Protocol. This year, the District expanded the Protocol to Middle School. The Attendance Protocol supports the idea that regular attendance is mandatory for all students enrolled in ASD-N schools. Research demonstrates a strong correlation between student attendance and student achievement. These protocols will ensure that everyone may be guaranteed the same opportunities for a quality education and a productive future. Should a student miss 4 days, homeroom teachers will initiate contact with the home. At 6 absences, students will be referred to Guidance to complete the Attendance Checklist. At 8 absences, homeroom teachers will again contact home. At 10 absences, an Attendance Intervention Plan will be created with the student, administration, and the parents/guardians. Should a student miss 20 days of school and if the student continues to be absent after all appropriate interventions have been attempted, this student is, in effect, non-compliant with school rules. A student is considered to have excessive absences if they miss 12 days.

STOP BULLYING




